Pilot the SLE Quantitative Toolkit and Receive In-Country Training and Technical Assistance from ECCN

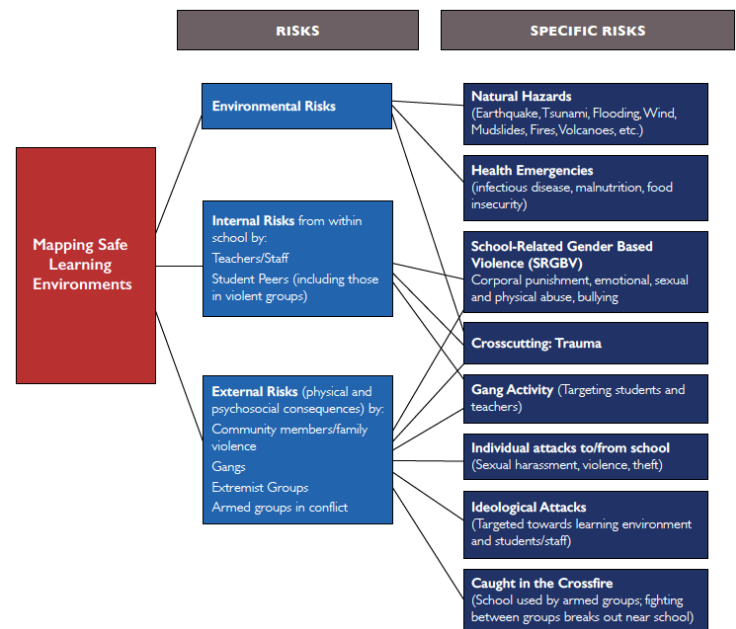
ECCN is looking for partners working on education projects in a crisis or conflict environment to pilot this innovative toolkit. In exchange, we'll work closely with your local staff as they conduct the assessment that will inform your EiCC programming.

What is the toolkit's purpose?

The assessment toolkit will help researchers and practitioners identify and quantify the specific risks to safer learning environments (SLE) in program areas.

What sets this toolkit apart?

- Relies on ECCN's SLE Conceptual Framework that differentiates multiple types of risks to safety (see figure)
- Utilizes portions of eight existing school safety assessment tools
- Highly detailed but adaptable
- Appropriate for junior or expert researchers
- Rapid (six-week) process
- Yields actionable and user-friendly descriptive report



What does my involvement in the pilot entail?

ECCN will:

- Provide in-country support from our Research Manager to train teams and oversee launch
- Provide ongoing virtual support for duration of piloting exercise
- Invite you to a discussion forum to engage with other piloting teams
